8 – Overall views on participation		The views in this paper are an accurate account of those expressed at Moorclose Community Centre – Knit 'n' natter group on Monday 19 March 2012. There is an understanding and acceptance that radioactive waste has to be stored somewhere – but the overwhelming view is that it shouldn't be in Cumbria. The group were suspicious of how seriously any consultation findings will be used. All felt the outcome is a foregone conclusion. When pressed a majority would agree to further participation if there were guarantees as to suitability, and safety and guarantees of the right to withdraw at any time from the process; and that they express serious reservations; and great scepticism was expressed about on-going decision making and the full benefits to the area and its community. There were 8 people involved in the discussion.
